Year 4

English

We will be studying a range of genres and creating pieces of writing based on the following stimuli:

FARther

Remembrance Day: Poetry

Discursive Writing

Reading

The Boy Who Biked The World, Story of Flight, Stitch Head

Music: Glockenspiels

This is a six-week Unit of Work that introduces the children to learning about the language of music through playing the glockenspiel.

The learning is focused around exploring eloping playing skills through the glockenspiel, building on what they learnt in Year 3 .

DT: Pop-up Books

Year 4 will have the chance to explore moving parts in a variety of storybooks and learn how to recreate some of these moving parts using a variety of tools and techniques before investigating different types of fonts and graphics. And finally, putting their new-found skills to the test, the children will design, create and evaluate their very own moving storybooks.

History - Roman Britain

Who lived in Roman Britain?

What was life like in a Roman town and how were those towns connected?

What did the Romans believe and did they bring their beliefs to Britain?

How did the Romans link Britain to the rest of the Roman Empire?

What influence have the Romans had on our words and numbers?

What can we learn by investigating an archaeological site?

Spanish - En mi tiempo libre

Opinions of free time activities (infinitives), days of the week, conjunctions, adjectives: reasons for opinions, immediate future tense: voy a + infinitives

Computing: E-Safety

Year 4 will be learning about how to stay safe online.

Maths

Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12×12 Recognise and use commutativity in mental calculations.

Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally.

Multiply 2- digit and 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number using formal written layout. Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally.

Science - Electricity

Looking at how circuits work, the differences between mains and battery powered electricity, how to make a switch, which materials are conductors and which are insulators, with plenty of opportunities for investigations and experiments.

PSHE - Celebrating Differences

I can tell you a time when my first impression of someone changed as I got to know them.

I can also explain why bullying might be difficult to spot and what to do about it if I'm not sure.

I can explain why it is good to accept myself and others for who we are.

RE - What is the most significant part of the Nativity story for Christians today?

I can design a symbolic object to show the significance of Christmas or the Christmas holiday to me.

I can describe one thing a Christian might learn about Jesus from a Christmas symbol.

I can ask questions about what Christmas means to Christians and compare this with what it means to me.



PE: Netball - Children develop movement and ball handling skills. They learn simple attacking tactics as part of a small team, and start to think about how to organise themselves to defend their goal. Play with a basic court set-up.
