

Turn on the Subtitles!

Turning on the subtitles while children are watching television can **double the chances of a child becoming good at reading**[†]. It's so brilliantly simple and can help children's literacy so much that we want to shout it from the rooftops!

†Based on an academic study of 2,350 children, 34% became good readers with schooling alone. But when exposed to 30 minutes a week of subtitled film songs, that proportion more than doubled to 70%. There are lots of studies about the benefits of subtitles. This is just one! Check out our <u>research page</u> to find out more.



Parking




Spotlight on Mr Kennedy



Get Ready for 'Jeans for Genes' - Friday 22nd September
