Aragon Primary School Curriculum Map

Year 4

English

We will be studying a range of genres and creating pieces of writing based on the following stimuli:

The Spiderwick Chronicles - Mystery Stories

Various Stimuli - Explanation Text

Maths

Interpret and present discrete and continuous data using appropriate graphical methods, including bar charts. Solve comparison problems using information presented in bar charts.

Count up and down in hundredths; recognise that hundredths arise when dividing an object by 100 and by dividing tenths by 10. Solve problems involving increasingly harder fractions to calculate quantities, and fractions to divide quantities, including non-unit fractions where the answer is a whole number. Recognise and show families of common equivalent fractions using diagrams. Add/subtract fractions with the same denominator.

Music - Compose with Friends

To learn, when you are composing music together, there is a lot to remember! Music is often written based on various key signatures that guide melodies used in the music. There is often a note that sounds like 'home', or where a melody should 'land'. This is called the 'tonic pitch' or the 'home note' and makes a melody or a song sound final - like it has been resolved.

Science - Sound

Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating. Recognise that vibrations from a sound travel through a medium to the ear. Find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it. Find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it. Recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.

Computing: Programming

This unit is the first of the two programming units in Year 4, and looks at repetition and loops within programming. Pupils will create programs by planning, modifying, and testing commands to create shapes and patterns. They will use Logo, a text-based programming language.
